- c. 'Religions have bigger issues to resolve than the environment.' Discuss this statement. In your answer you must include more than one point of view, at least one of which should be from a major world religion. You must also come to a justified personal opinion. (8)

Question Two (Evil and Suffering)

- a. Describe and illustrate the differences between natural and moral evil. (4)
- b. Explain why the problem of evil and suffering is problematic for one major world religion. (8)

Question Four (Life after Death)

- a. Describe four features of the afterlife within one major world religion. (4)
